This event is for managers, members of support services, special schools, agencies and organisations working together to secure better outcomes for children and young people with sensory impairment (CYP with SI).

We encourage colleagues working across education, social care and health to attend and explore what it means to put the voice of the young person at the heart of service provision in response to the SEND reforms. The focus will be on active participation of young people 12– 25yrs. The day offers opportunity for networking before presentations begin at 11am.

This event will have a new format for the morning with three shorter keynote presentations from national speakers and the opportunity for delegate participation with discussion and questions to a panel.

The day will include presentations from:

- **Jan Miller** from the **DfE**, who will talk about the government strategy for improving outcomes for young people through participation and the challenges to Local Areas
- **Amanda Allard** from the **Council for Disabled Children's** participation team will talk about the work of CDC with DfE through EPIC (the young people's group)
- **Julie Pointer** from **Preparing for Adulthood/National Development Team for Inclusion**) will speak alongside a with a young person on planning for successful transitions
- **Brian Lamb** will summarise developments in the context of NatSIP and SI CYP
- There will be an update on the NatSIP workstreams delivering the DfE grant during 2015 - 16

Working groups will focus on: NatSIP Outcomes Benchmarking, and the Voice of the Young Person (with HI, VI and MSI/Complex needs)

The cost for the day is £100/delegate, reduced to £50/delegate for NatSIP-affiliated organisations
