Course title: A Practical Approach to Supporting Access to learning for Children and Young People with Deafblindness/Multi-Sensory Impairment.

A 5 day taught course in Autumn 2022 covering key areas of working with deafblind/MSI learners. There are 15 places available on this course for professionals who currently provide direct support for deafblind children / young people.

Delegates on the course will have the opportunity to identify and share good practice, whilst receiving support from a mentor. A mentor could be identified locally by participants and agreed with course organisers or mentoring will be provided at additional cost.
