The focus of the day will be upon meeting the challenges of the SEND legislation in respect of the post-16 education, training and employment.

In particular, it will be an opportunity for delegates to input into the development of best practice guidance in a range of areas.

Jude Thompson from RLSB will lead the day, with support from staff from NDCS, looking at implications of the Act post 16 provision and outcomes for young people with sensory impairment and for the services and professionals supporting them.

Delegates will have the opportunity to comment on and contribute to best practice guidance documents focusing on:

- Supporting effective decision making (careers advice and independence);
- Transition processes;
- Provision in Further Education settings;
- Effective support into and in the workplace.
