

## Sign language for family life

Want to help families in your area use sign language at home with their deaf children? Then apply for a grant to help you to set up a Family Sign Language course in your area.

Grants of up to £600 are available and are open to groups or organisations in England currently working with deaf children aged 0 – 5 years old.

The deadline for applications is December 2014.

Family Sign Language (FSL) courses are different to traditional British Sign Language courses. Through 20 hours of classroom time with a qualified FSL teacher they introduce families to the signs and phrases they need for telling stories and nursery rhymes as well as practical communication about food, sleeping and play.

## How do the grants work?

Our Family Sign Language grants are up to £600 and can be used to partially fund some of the costs of setting up and running a course such as hiring a Family Sign Language teacher or booking a room.
